Rainbows invitation to Cinderella's ball

Rainbow had a fabulous time at Cinderella's Ball on Friday. The children enjoyed ballroom dancing and having a scrumptious tea party. Rainbows also had a few special guests visit them including the Fairy Godmother, the Prince and Cinderella.















In our Art lessons this term, we are exploring the work of Alice Kettle and Hannah Rae. Both are artists who use mixed media to create their work. We have begun by comparing their styles and deciding what we like and dislike about them and then we will imitate their work using paint and textiles.



In Year 3, we have also been using paint on calico fabric to create backgrounds representing the sea, rivers, mountains or forest. We built up layers of colours so that when our work is dry, it will be textured. When the paint had dried, we used a needle and thread to sew details onto our landscapes.







In Year 5, we have been looking at mythical beasts as part of our classical studies in Latin. We discussed the gods of Mount Olympus and the depths of the underworld. Following on from our discussions, we then created our own mythical beasts and spoke about how each beast had a power gifted to them by the gods of Mount Olympus or the depths of the underworld





In Year 5, we have also been working collaboratively to translate a story about the health and cleanliness of our Vindolanda family in Roman Britain. There is a great website into the archaeology of Vindolanda that we used to do our research which was all about the history of Vindolanda and the Roman Army Museum. The minimus scheme that we used is based on this ancient fortified town. Archaeological discoveries bring the texts we read and translate to life.
